6. Governance, Leadership and Management

6.1 State the Vision and Mission of the institution

The Vision and Mission statement of the institution is:

''ज्ञान, विज्ञान आणि सुसंस्कार यांसाठी शिक्षणप्रसार'' is the motto of our college and Institution. The vision statements are:

- i) To provide quality education to all by means of sheer hard work, dedication and devotion.
- ii) Education to promote scientific temper.
- iii) Education to inculcate cultural values into students and to make them better citizen of India with vision and values.
- iv) To ensure values like truth, honesty, character, true science, sacrifice into students and to curb exploitation through education among them.
- v) To aim at overall personality development through extracurricular activities.
- vi) To attain community and social development through infrastructural facilities of the college.
- vii) To provide a platform to the students to enhance their skills/ potentials as well as a sense of social responsibility and nationality through sports, cultural activities, NCC, NSS and other events.
- viii) To train the students to face competitive examination.
- ix) To help the students for the job training and placement of jobs wherever possible.

6.2 Does the Institution has a Management Information System

Yes. The college has Management Information System and it works very well. The college, through the various working committees like Grievance Redresal Cell, Cultural Committee, Magazine Committee, Anti-ranging Committee, Women Students' Sexual Harassment Prevention Cell, NAAC and IQAC, completes the work of Management Information System.

The college has adopted schemes of self-appraisal of teaching staff, students' feedback and academic audit by Sanstha Vidya Samiti.

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

The college is affiliated to Shivaji University, Kolhapur. University designs syllabus and college implements it.

The faculty members participate in workshops on revised syllabus and communicate their views and suggestions with B. O. S. members.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

For the smooth and effective teaching and learning process, the following methods are used by the college:

- * In the beginning of the academic year, faculty prepare teaching plan.
- * Interactive methods such as Seminar, Group Discussion, Question-answer.
- * Use of chart, maps, diagram and other teaching aids.
- * Few members of faculty use ICT.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

- * The Examination and Evaluation methods of University and internal examination, test, home assignments, project work are communicated to the students through prospects.
- * The circulars and notices of the concerned examinations are displayed on the college notice board. Besides, they are communicated by the teacher orally to the students
- * The examination department of college conducts all examination as per the rule and the instructions by the University.
- * The evaluation of Question papers of B. A. Part I and B. Com Part I is done at college level according to the rules and norms by the University.

6.3.4 Research and Development

The college has a research committee. It gives facilities and promotion to the teachers for research work, research papers, major/minor project and M. Phil/ Ph. D. research

- * Minor Research Project Proposal has submitted.
- * Three members of faculty are doing Ph. D. research

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

- * New books are purchased for the updating library
- *Library is partially computerized.

However, the college has limited financial resources, there are plans for a separate library building and other essential constructions in near future.

* The college has sufficient computerization.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

At the beginning of the academic year, the formation of various committees are fixed for smooth running of college.

The college teaching faculty has 22 sanctioned post and non-teaching 8 sanctioned post.

Through regular meetings of the staff and faculty, new decisions or changes in previous are communicated to all. Decision making system is a democratic one. So the faculty and staff is also promoted to give their suggestions and ideas, while making decisions to run the college smoothly.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

The management strictly follows the selection and appointment rules laid down by the U. G. C., University and State Government for the recruitment of vacant post as per the requirement of the college.

Besides, every year, temporary C. H. B. appointments are made by L. M. C. (Local Management Committee) as per requirement.

7 new teachers are appointed on C. H. B.

6.3.9 Admission of Students

The Admission Procedure strictly follows the rules and regulations stipulated by the Govt. of Maharashtra and Shivaji University, Kolhapur.

The students completed H.S.C. or equivalent qualification, the admission is given on the basis of the first come first serve.

The admission committee of senior members of faculty is appointed by the Principal. It provides counselling to the students and parents regarding the choice of subject-combination. The cut of Merit of the admission is 35%.
