The college is affiliated to Shivaji University, Kolhapur. University designs syllabus and college implements it.

The faculty members participate in workshops on revised syllabus and communicate their views and suggestions with B. O. S. members.

For the smooth and effective teaching and learning process, the following methods are used by the college :

- \* The evaluation of Question papers of B. A. Part I and B. Com Part I is done at college level according to the rules and norms by the University.

The management strictly follows the selection and appointment rules laid down by the U. G. C., University and State Government for the recruitment of vacant post as per the requirement of the college.

Besides, every year, temporary C. H. B. appointments are made by L. M. C. (Local Management Committee) as per requirement.

7 new teachers are appointed on C. H. B.


